Moments That Matter: The Cronin Family's Story

"The Aroostook House of Comfort is true to its name, a place of genuine comfort, not just for the patients, but for their families as well. Prior to 2024, I was familiar with the Aroostook House of Comfort but had never experienced its care personally.

Then, in 2024, I found myself there twice, saying goodbye to two loved ones during their final days. Through my first experience, I witnessed firsthand the true meaning of comfort and compassion. I knew without a doubt that my sister and I would eventually take our stepmother, Katie, there when the time came. As a caregiver, it is important to talk about the end of life with your loved ones and have a plan, even if it is basic.

For us, it started with Northern Light Home Care & Hospice and then the Aroostook House of Comfort. From the moment we walked through the doors, a weight was lifted from our shoulders. We were met with kindness, warmth, and an unwavering commitment to making sure both Katie and our family were supported every step of the way. As Katie's daughters and caregivers, while also balancing our own young families and full-time jobs, the Aroostook House of Comfort gave us the greatest gift, the ability to simply be daughters. In those final days, we no longer had to worry about the physical and medical aspects of her care because we knew she was in the most compassionate and capable hands. Being at the Aroostook House of Comfort allowed us to focus on what truly mattered-being there for Katie, surrounding her with love, and giving her the support she deserved. The entire staff at the Aroostook House of Comfort was exceptional, treating Katie with unwavering kindness, compassion, and dignity. Always ensuring that she was comfortable and peaceful. They were at their best when we needed them the most, guiding us through our 7-day journey with care and support. We spent precious time at her bedside around the clock, sharing stories and memories. The living room and kitchen areas provided a comforting space for our young families to gather, allowing us to be together in a home-like setting.

I cannot recommend the Aroostook House of Comfort enough to anyone facing the heart-breaking journey of saying goodbye to a loved one. My family is eternally grateful for the Aroostook House of Comfort, and they will always have our support." - Kristen Clark



Volunteer Spotlight: Heidi Thompson

Why did you choose hospice care as a volunteer experience?

In 2017, my 16-year-old son was in a serious car accident. During his recovery, we met so many kind people, including a nurse named Heidi who cared deeply for both him and us as parents. That compassion stayed with me. Once my son regained his independence, I felt called to give back. After visiting the Aroostook House of Comfort, I knew it was the place where I could truly make a difference.

How long have you volunteered at the Aroostook House of Comfort?

This May marks four years—I call it my "side gig." I've worked at The County Federal Credit Union for thirty-four years and usually volunteer on weekends. I'm grateful my employer supports community involvement.

How does your work help?

Whether it's preparing a favorite meal, celebrating a holiday early, or sitting with someone who has no family, I try to be a source of comfort. When my cousin passed in 2024, I felt peace, thanks to all I had learned at AHOC. I want to give that same peace to others.

What makes AHOC special?

It feels like home, not a hospital. Families can rest while their loved one is cared for with compassion. They get to just be present.

Most rewarding moment?

Fulfilling final wishes means everything. A last meal, a breath of fresh air—these moments matter. When someone hugs me later and says, "I'll never forget you," I know I've made a difference.








Every Name Tells a Story: AHOC Naming Opportunities


